The Holiday Inn - University Plaza in Bowling Green has opened more rooms for the convention. Deadline for hotels is May 21st. There were 200 people that registered in the first 30 minutes of opening of registration. As of February 25th, there are 697 members registered for the convention. Cost for factory tours is \$35.00 for Museum members and \$50.00 for non-members. They offer "your car", in a C-8, in a C-7 or in a new Z06.

2024 Convention will be in Joplin, Missouri. Hotels are in place and the high speed and low speed venues are set. 2025 Convention will probably be in Syracuse, New York.

An interview with Club members Mark Williams

Mark first drove a Corvette at age 17. In high school, he liked to hang out at a Shell gas station owned by his friend's father. Leon's dad bought at '62 red corvette and let Mark drive it. Mark decided to drive it home to show his parents. His mother was hanging out laundry, and saw him drive in, and yelled "Take That Back!" Then added in a threatening voice, "Your dad will be home soon!" It would be several years later before Mark had his own Corvette.

When Mark and Mary decided to get a Corvette, Mark wanted a red one, but Mary wanted the color "Black Rose." The agreement was that they would get Black Rose this time, and the next one would be red. They found their '92 Black Rose Coupe in Charleston in 1995, and drove it until 2019. Mark had no trouble selling it, a neighbor had asked to buy it for years, every time he saw it in Mark's driveway, so was happy when Mark sold it to him. Mark said the neighbor is still driving it.



Mark finally got his red Corvette in 2019 ... a '19 Grand Sport in Torch Red, from Leeman's in Bloomington, that he saw online.



When Mark had his '92 serviced at Sullivan's, he met Dave Rich, who told him about the Club. The first meeting they came to, they saw John & Connie Strehlow ... Connie worked with Mary. They liked the Club and joined.

Mark and Mary had gone to the NCM and Funfest even before joining the Club.

They've been to Bloomington Gold in Springfield, St Charles, Champaign, and Mark particularly enjoyed driving the cars for sale at the Mecum Auto Auction when BG was held in Champaign. Mark drove a '61 across the auction, stopped and turned it off as instructed. When he needed to drive it off, the car wouldn't start. It belonged to Mecum and had a problem they knew about ... it didn't sell.

Some of Mark's favorite Club events included going to NCM when Ray Quinlan was inducted, dinner cruises, and when DAR had a reception for the veterans at a meeting. You can see from the picture that he enjoyed driving in the Hoopeston parade! He has no ambition to be an officer, saying "everyone is doing a fine job." He appreciates that many members do lots of work to keep the club going. He is concerned that our data base has older people, and is worried that we don't have many young people in the Club. "But," he added, "young people can't afford a new Corvette!"



An interview with Club members Mark Williams continued By Carol Castellon

Mark moved to Urbana 45 years ago so his son could attend Wiley School. That school had a good reputation at that time. It closed after he moved here, and his son attended Yankee Ridge School. Mark retired in March 2006 and his wife Mary retired in November the same year.

Mark grew up in Decatur, graduating in 1963 from McArthur HS. At that time, there were 5 high schools in Decatur and lots of young people! After HS, he started working for AT&T until he was drafted. He was sent to Frankfort Germany, working for the Inspector General's Team. When he got to Germany, he "committed the biggest sin" ... he volunteered for something! When the commander asked if anyone could type, Mark raised his hand and volunteered. At that time, the typewriters were the old mechanical type, not electric. He got the job with the 3rd Armored Division, working for the Senior NCO's who



really ran the Army. In 13 months, he was an NCO. He went to Combat Engineering School Fort Leonard Wood in 1965 building bridges.



After his military service, he went back to Decatur, but wasn't able to work for AT&T, came to Champaign and worked for III Bell. In 1984, AT&T was broken up into smaller companies, he then went to the Interstate Research Park working for the networks and business section of the company. When AT&T switched to a computers business, he went too, first working for Olivetti, which got involved in Unix operating systems at the time, when the University of Illinois was their biggest client. Then he switched to NCR, actually a computer company who got lots of government contracts. An NCR office in Danville inherited Mark. After 37 years, there was a retirement incentive. He ended up going to Bloomington and worked for State Farm, also did some work for Caterpillar. In 2000, he retired, but then stayed another seven years "getting paid more than I was worth." It is a 56-mile commute from his house to the State Farm Office in Bloomington, so he was glad to retire and end that long

commute.

He lost Mary in 2017, but has stayed active in the Club, and likes driving his Grand Sport. In retirement, he has made furniture and clocks. He enjoys being with his family; he has a son Paul and daughter in law Debbie and grandchildren Hayden and Emerson.
