



# Pictures for calendar



"Good Shooting: Lighting is Everything"

After several years of publishing the Club calendar, I've seen some good pictures and some not so good. I'm writing a series of "tips" that may help you get a good pic of your car. I'm not claiming to be a professional, these are just observations I've made over the years.

Pictures taken later in the afternoon (4:00), or earlier in the morning (9:00), on a clear day, make good pictures. Noon lighting directly overhead darkens people's faces, and does nothing to highlight the car. If you have the right light, then don't make the mistake of you facing the light to take the pic. Put your back to the light, get the light on the car so it sparkles. But watch for shadows where you are standing ... your shadow in the foreground is a distractor in your picture. If it starts to get dark, stop taking pictures, your car will look dull and the color of the picture will be "off."

I think that I have mentioned it before but also take a minute to take all your remotes for your Corvette and have them checked for good batteries. You can do this at an Advanced Auto, AutoZone, O'Reillys, NAPA, or a Dealership and they will usually check your remotes for free. You have to remember with C5, C6, and C7 Corvettes you have to have a fully charged battery to make all accessories work right.
