## An Interview with Club members Doug and Delora Hanner

In February 1973, Larry Retter sold his old Corvette to his brother-in-law, Doug Hanner. It was a '65 396 Nassau blue coupe. Doug heard about the Club and was told to find Bob & Linda Ogle if he wanted to join. Doug happened to see Bob & Linda driving in their '66 and followed them until he could stop them, then followed them to their house, where they spent the next 2 hours talking about cars! Doug and Delora joined the Club in June 1973, and Doug became President in January 1974.



Contrary to what members think, Doug has not always been the President of the Club. Doug sold his Vette in 1984, and could not be President because he didn't own a Corvette. Charlie Mornout was President for one year, and then Myron Kumler was President for one year. Doug bought a '65 "drumbrakes" coupe in 1986, and became President of the Club again. Delora served as Secretary and Treasurer "back in the day." They have fond memories of the Club and friends Dave Rich, Ogles, Hecklers, and Mechlings. Doug commented that Dennis Heckler loved coaching the women's golf team at our Golf Outing, probably because you could hear those women laughing all over those courses.

In 1988, Doug bought his 3<sup>rd</sup> Corvette, a 35<sup>th</sup> Anniversary edition. In 1997, his 4<sup>th</sup> Vette was a white coupe. His 5<sup>th</sup> Corvette was the 1964 Grand Sport that he still owns, and his 6<sup>th</sup> and current Corvette is a 2013 white Grand Sport. He took Museum delivery on it, and went to the factory and watched it being built for 3 days. Delora was the first person to start that car in the factory.

Doug graduated from Oakwood HS in 1971, and had proposed to Delora before he graduated. After graduation he joined the Army National Guard in Jun 1971. In September 1972, he got a job as a machinist that paid \$3.20/hour. He went on active duty with the Guard in August 1983, and retired in July 2002. He then took a job with the state of Illinois in Oct 2002 and plans to retire from it in December this year. Doug has always liked classic cars. He has a small business working on golf carts – buying & selling and restoring them. He likes traveling to military bases, and doesn't like yard work!



Delora accepted his marriage proposal, but her father told her she had to graduate from HS before she could get married, which they did in December 1972. They laughed when they mentioned their one-night Honeymoon at the Holiday Inn in Champaign, but back then, they had no money! Delora was born and raised in Gibson City, but after she married Doug, moved to Oakwood, where they have always lived. They have no children. Delora has held several jobs starting with housekeeping at Gibson City Hospital, office work for Walgreens (a job she hated because of the "elevator music" that played constantly), at Windbreaker where she sewed leisure suits, and finally at Cap & Gown





from January 1984 until she retired in October 2010. One other job on that list was at Skelly's Truck Stop as a waitress where the truck drivers teased her a lot until she "got toughened up and learned to give it back to them." Delora is a wonderful seamstress, and has made prom dresses, bridesmaid dresses, suits for men, and has done alterations. She loves puzzles, and is a "QVC nut."

They agreed that their favorite activities with the Club are the eating out and Club trips. They loved the Col-



orado and Maine trips. Doug said "trips are so much fun when we are with our Corvette family." Doug trailered their '65 on their first Colorado Club Trip, but they could never get it running good enough to enjoy the trip. Delora said they parked it near a cliff once, and she wanted to "push it over the cliff because it was no fun." When they returned home, they bought their '88.

Hanners have a brick at the NCM, in front of the store "next to the garbage can" as Doug joked. You won't find anyone as passionate about the Club, nor as vested in it, as Doug. At the next meeting, give Doug and Delora a big thanks for all the work they have done for years for this Club.

## An interview with Club member Ron Stonestreet

Ron Stonestreet bought an old officer's house on the old Chanute AFB in 1996. One day in 1999, he was driving to Menard's to buy grass seed for his yard (Menard's was located close to Sullivan's at that time) and he noticed a 2000 green C4 with low mileage and a low price. He was driving a white Dodge sportscar, and stopped to look at the Vette. When Sullivan's offered to sell the Vette to him for a price difference of \$10,000, he traded his car for it. Ron commented that grass seed cost him a lot of money!

Ron picked up the Vette the next day, and Sullivan's told him about the Club. He joined the Club in September 1999, and he gave me a copy of the Club newsletter dated January 2000, reporting that he joined in September. His first activity was the Hoopston Queen parade in that same September, before he officially joined. After the parade, he was sitting in the park with members and eating chicken they bought, and he said "I've driven a Queen in the parade with you, eaten your chicken, sat with you ... am I a member yet?" Doug said "Sure."



A few years later, Ron bought a 2005 C5 from Rogers Chevrolet in Rantoul. In 2007, Ron special-ordered a red C6, 6-speed manual, 400 with Z-51 suspension.



He's gone on many of the Club trips, 3 times to Colorado, and to Maine, Michigan, Yellowstone, and several times to NCM. He's been to Funfest many times, helped with the Autocross, attended many car shows, Dinner Dashes, and cruises. He commented that Doug has put a lot of hard work in the Club to make sure we have a lot of fun activities. He shared a photo album of a club trip to Colorado in 2000. He



prefers Club trips with adventures - I had the pleasure of going on a rather thrilling dune-buggy ride with him over dunes on a Michigan trip, when no one else wanted to go.

Ron was born in Champaign, then attended Rantoul HS, and graduated from SIU in 1966. He had joined ROTC before he graduated, and was a commissioned officer in the Air Force, ended up retiring as a Major. He went to many schools including learning about B52's and "Engine Accident Investigation School" among others. His first assignment was at Kincheloe AFB, now closed, as are all the AFBs where he was stationed - Arthur Rapp teases him that they don't let him on AFB's now because he might cause them to close too! He said Kincheloe was very cold "you can't do anything outside in the winter without freezing" so he volunteered to go somewhere warm. He ended up at Utapao AFB in Thailand where he co-piloted B52-H's. He flew about 30 missions, including selected targets in Cambodia a Viet Nam. He then transferred to Lockbourne AFB in Ohio, and then Davis-Monthan AFB near Tuscon. He spent his last year with National Guard in Peoria, commuting from Rantoul.



He ended up at Utapao AFB in Thailand where he co-piloted B52-H's. He flew about 30 missions, including selected targets in Cambodia a Viet Nam. He then transferred to Lockbourne AFB in Ohio, and then Davis-Monthan AFB near Tuscon. He spent his last year with National Guard in Peoria, commuting from Rantoul.

After retiring from the Air Force, he worked for IL Light & Power in Rantoul, then the electric department for Rantoul Village retiring again at 55. He had been collecting coins for 40 years and started buying and selling coins online, and still does as a hobby/business.

About 3 years ago, he was diagnosed with cancer and went through chemo and radiation. During his 44 radiation treatments over a 3-month period, he rode his bicycle every day after treatments and thinks that helped with having no side-effects. His dog "Gumbo" – a shelter dog mostly hounddog mix – was good company for him. About the time he started feeling better, Covid hit, so he hasn't been active with the Club for 3 years now. He hopes to start coming to meetings again. When you see him, please tell him you are glad he's feeling good now!
