This month we take a look at the Black Dog Smoke and Ale House with locations in Champaign and Urbana. The Urbana Black Dog opened in February 2009 with the Champaign location opening in September 2015. Barbeque is the specialty at the Black Dog. BBQ sandwiches and platters of beef, pork, chicken and turkey are available. Pork and beef ribs and rib tips are also available. Smoked catfish and salmon sandwiches are on the menu ,as well as a Vegan burger called the "Impossible Burger". Numerous house-made sides and salads are available. The Black Dog offers nine different BBQ sauces ranging from mild to extra hot. Daily lunch and dinner specials are available as well as a Sunday Brunch special.

The Champaign and Urbana locations' menu do differ slightly, so please visit their web site to view each one.
