DOUG'S TECH TIPS

For all C7 owners, if you have a problem with the seatbelt restraints on the headrests, Dick Lampe has come up with an ingenious idea. He found that if you go to your local pet store and pick up some of the tubing used for the filtration systems in fish aquariums, it can be cut to go into the void in the restraint. See photo to right.

There was a little situation that happened to Greg Anderson and Kristie Smith on their travels to Bloomington Gold. They had just got onto the interstate in Decatur, when their Corvette lost power and stopped completely. Greg opened the hood to find that his dual snorkel air cleaner was detached. With further inspection, he noticed that the mass flow valve was clogged with leaves. The leaves had gotten positioned to completely block the air cleaner, causing it to dislodge. The leaves then covered the mass flow valve, causing their Corvette to stall. It is a good idea to check the air intake under the car and behind the front bumper. The moral of the story is to make sure that the air intake under the front of your C5 is free of road debris.
