Good Shooting

The second in a short series of articles with suggestions for taking better pictures of your car, by Carol Castellon I've noticed that the angle of the picture is really important. The height at which the picture is taken really makes a difference in a good shot. If you notice the background, so will people who look at your photo. If you want a pretty sky to highlight your car, then lay down on the ground and take the picture from a low position looking upward toward the car so the sky will frame it. If the background is a field (of corn or wheat), I suggest getting on a ladder and look down toward your car, so that the car color stands out against the field. A high position usually works better if the background is your house. If you want a person to be featured, then a straight-on short works well, because the person's face can be seen better.

Sometimes where you stand - the angle to the car is important. A photo with a waterfall or lake looks better if you stand at a 45° angel in front of the car, and this is also true for an object such as a statue in the background. Even standing slightly off of 90° to the side of a car makes a better picture. Maybe you've noticed that many nice pics of cars feature the car at an angle? Well, that's really the photographer at an angle!

I'm going to show an example of how an angle makes a better picture with one of Doug's cars (hope he doesn't mind). Notice the background is improved when I laid down on the ground for the picture and took it looking upward - the word ILLINI is clearly visible and the cars have a sleeker look.
