-As parades may once again be held, you may want to consider displaying flags on your 'Vette. Flag "caddies" with American flags are available from many after market Corvette suppliers. We have for sale, small club flags available to replace one of the American flags, so you end up with one American and one club flag to display.

-On club road trips, we use CB radios for car-to-car communications. If you already have one, we use Channel 13. If you are considering getting one, there are many club members who can advise you on what to do.

-Make sure you have current stickers on your license plates and have the current

registration and insurance cards in the glove box.

-Consider carrying a small fire extinguisher and first aid kit.

-Also, tire plugging kits, 12 volt air compressor, tire gauge and a small selection of hand tools, along with a quart of appropriate motor oil are a great idea. Again, many members are available to help advise you.

-In addition, you may want to carry the correct mobile charger cord for your cell phone.

-One point of caravan etiquette, when the car in front of you turns on their turn signal, please turn yours on as well, so the car behind you knows which way the caravan is headed. This is very important if there is a great distance between cars.

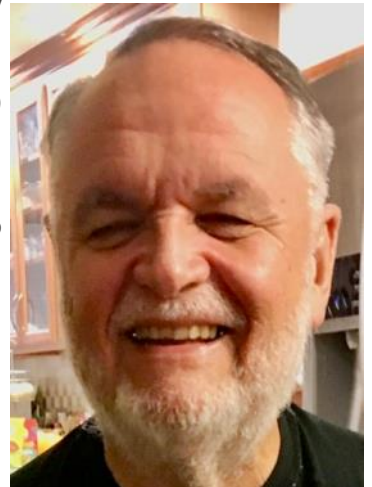

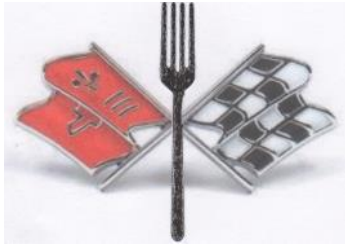
