

The Oasis Diner in Plainfield is just the place for those seeking to re-live memories of the roadside diners of the past. Originally established in 1954, the Oasis has gone through many changes and owners. The Oasis was totally shut down in 2008.

Indiana Landmarks, a private historical preservation group, purchased the building and eventually sold it to the current owners Doug Huff and Don Rector. After moving the structure to its current location and with extensive interior and exterior restoration, brought the Oasis back to its original appearance. The Oasis was re-opened in all its glory in November of 2014.

The Oasis menu offers many breakfast, lunch, and dinner options. Many traditional "diner foods" are to be found on their menu. As there are far too many choices to list here, please visit their website to view the menu, and read more about the Oasis' history. One item of note is their "breaded pork tenderloin sandwich" which has been rated as one of the top ten tenderloin sandwiches in Indiana.

"Our Navy's First Flag"

An Essay for the Observance of the 250th Anniversary of the United States Navy

In April, 1775, British troops were occupying Boston. Militias from the local communities were stationed around Boston. George Washington felt it was vital to be able to attack the British troops by sea as well as on land, but we had no Navy. Congress was reluctant to form a Navy, trying not to provoke the British, and they had no money or legal authority to create one. Unafraid, Washington commissioned seven ships and outfitted them at his own expense.

The first ship commissioned was the Hannah, now considered the founding vessel of our Navy. Washington then commissioned six more ships: Hancock, Washington, Lee, Harrison, and schooners Lynch and Franklin. These were referred to as Washington Cruisers. Their first mission was to prevent the British from resupplying the British troops inside Boston. These six cruisers continued to wreak havoc on British shipping for the next year.

Washington also commissioned floating batteries with holes in the sides for muskets, to be floated down the Charles River and fire on Boston. The flag that flew on these batteries was described by Col Joseph Reed in a letter dated October 20, 1775: "What do you think of a flag with a white ground, a tree in the middle, the motto 'An Appeal to Heaven?' This is the flag of our floating batteries." After this letter, the flag was also flown on the six cruisers.



In New England colonies, the white pine tree was a symbol of independence. Washington chose the pine tree image as a gesture of solidarity between northern and southern colonies.

The phrase "Appeal to Heaven" appeared in a letter written by Dr. Joseph Warren shortly after the Battles of Lexington and Concord on behalf of the Massachusetts Provincial Congress to Great Britain. The letter states in part: "... to the persecution and tyranny of his cruel ministry, we will not tamely submit; appealing to Heaven for the justice of our cause, we determine to die, or be free."

On October 13, 1775, the Continental Congress authorized construction and administration of the first American naval force, which became the United States Navy.
