For those who may be attending the “Vettes N Vets “ car show at the American Legion in Carmel on Saturday August 20, consider dining at Bub’s Burgers & Ice Cream. Bub’s is home of the “Big Ugly Burger. Bub’s was established in 2003 and has two other restaurants in central and south central Indiana. Due to supply issues for buns and bread used in their products, Bub’s opened their own bakery (Lucy’s Bakery in Indianapolis) to supply custom made quality buns and breads to “fit” their sandwiches all their locations.

Burgers are the speciality of the house. Bub’s uses fresh hand-pattied ground chuck. Bub’s Burgers come in four sizes. The “Mini-Bub” at 1/8 lb , the “Settle for Less Ugly” at ¼ lb , the “Not So Ugly” at ½ lb, and the “Big Ugly” at 1 lb. Consume the “Big Ugly” and get your picture on the wall. In addition to regular beef burgers, Bub’s offers Bub’ Dogs in a 6” long ¼ lb and a 10” ½ lb. dog.

Elk burgers are available as well as chili, grilled Mahi Mahi and grilled chicken sandwiches.
