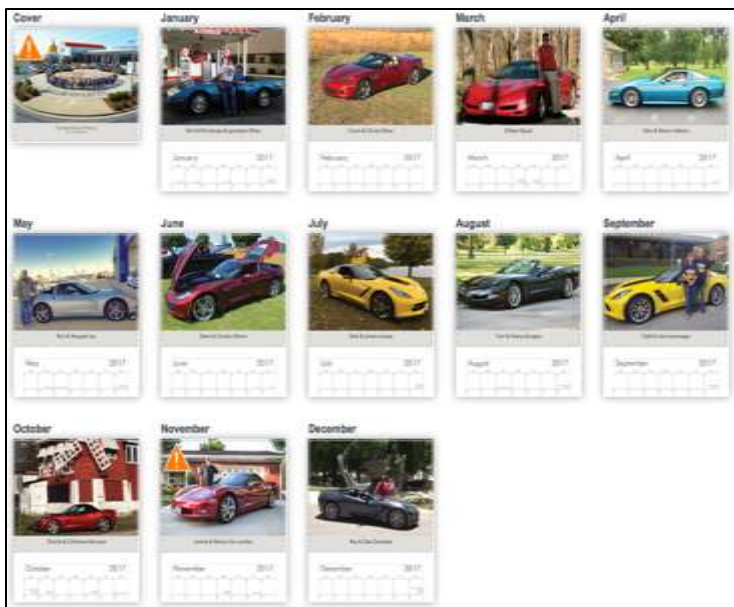




Carol Castellon reports on her recent trip to The National Corvette Museum.

We attended the Veteran Appreciation luncheon on Nov 3, attended by about 300 veterans and wives, and sat by a WWII veteran who’d just ridden around the race track in a Vette, one of the activities for veterans. Deli sandwiches such as Corned Beef, Pastrami, Ruben, along with others, are HUGE.

Thankfully you can order "half size" sandwiches, unless you want to take some home.

Shapiro's has an in-house bakery for all their breads and pastry items. You can even purchase some of those baked goods if they are not sold out.
