TRAVEL ACCESORY SUGGESTION

For those who may travel in states that have toll ways, it might be wise to consider purchasing an Illinois Tollway "I-Pass" Transponder. If you are not familiar with this device, it is a small electronic device that mounts on your vehicles windshield near your rear-view mirror.

The transponder allows you to drive in the "I-Pass only lanes", so that you do not have to stop and pay the toll at the toll booth. Another advantage is that "toll fees" are half price when you use the transponder in Illinois.

The Illinois I-Pass system is part of the E-ZPass group that allows you to use the transponder in 16 other states and 27 toll systems. Those states are mainly to the east and northeast of Illinois. (see tollway web page for more information on E-ZPass states)

You can use one transponder for multiple vehicles, as long as you register the additional vehicles with the tollway authority and remember to move the transponder you will be driving on the tollways.

You can purchase the transponders by mail or e-mail from the Illinois Tollway or stop by a Jewel-Osco store. The closest location is in the Kankakee area.

Basically the cost is \$30, \$10 for deposit and \$20 for prepaid tolls.

Debby and I have had a transponder for over ten years and it really works great for us.

An option that we use is the automatic replenishment feature, where we have our credit card on file, so that if our balance gets too low, it automatically charges our card \$20 for more prepaid tolls. This way we never have to worry about manually replenishing the tolls.

DOUG'S TECH TIP: This month for my Tech Tip I want to reinforce the Tech Tip that had been published in a previous newsletter about battery replacement. I was contacted by one of our former members about a 2010 Grand Sport with a dry sump oil system with less than 15,000 miles on the odometer not starting. They were wanting to know how to jump start the engine with a battery pack. The first thing that I told them was not to use a booster battery charger directly on the engine and just remove the battery and bench charge it to be safe. The battery checked out bad, so they replaced it and they have not had any problems since. The reason that I wanted to republish this Tech Tip was to make you think about checking your batteries, even on low mileage Vettes.
