Located between Gibson City and Paxton, just north of Route 9 in the town of Elliot, is the Blue Fish Café. The café is owned by Angie Rouley who is also the cook, entertainer and free spirit, for the past three years.

The Blue Fish Café is a no nonsense, limited menu, limited hour eatery.

They feature a breakfast menu and lunch menu (see below). Daily "Specials" are also available.

Virtually everything at the Blue Fish is made from scratch, including their home made buns.

This is some "serious" food, especially if you are a "Foodie".

Although they do not have a web site, they do have a Facebook location that I highly recommend you visit to view some of their past "Specials" and other going on's.
