For C-6 & C-7, keep the key fob away from the car. Do not hang it in the garage or even on the other side of the door in the house. The fob and car will try to connect and will drain your battery. Keep the key fob several feet away. If the fob is stored close to car, keep the car on a battery tender.

Also, for C-6 & C-7, change your cabin air filter. It is located on the passenger side, there are 3 clips to flip, pull out old filter, note the direction arrow and place new filter in the same direction.

TECH TIP: This is the Tech Tip for this month. If you own a C6 and have never changed your Cabin Air Filter. You might want to get that done before we get into this Busy Corvette Summer. The Cabin Air Filter is located on the Passenger side of the engine compartment, just locate the two spring loaded latches on the firewall. You will have to remove the plastic door and locate the Cabin Air Filter. I replaced ours with the better version to make for better Air Flow. If you have any questions or have a problem locating the filter I can you help you out at a meeting.
